

Degree Requirements for Minor in Applied Communication Studies (Revised Fall 2019)

To be accepted as a minor in Applied Communication Studies, a student must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher (on a 4.0 point scale). An 18-hour minor in Applied Communication Studies should comprise of ACS 103, ACS 203, ACS 213, plus **two** 300-level and **one** 400-level courses in the Applied Communication Studies curriculum. Courses that are restricted for ACS majors only **CANNOT** be taken by you to fulfill the 18 credit hours needed for this minor. A comprehensive list of available courses is listed below. Students should work in consultation with their respective major advisor and the Undergraduate Program Director of the Department of Applied Communication Studies to determine which courses best meet the students' academic and career interests. At the time they apply for their minor, students should consult with the Undergraduate Program Director of the Department of Applied Communication Studies at (618) 650-3090. Also note that 313 and 315 are block classes, and must be taken concurrently.
