#### **Admissions Criteria**

- 1. Completion of all DECLARATION requirements (listed on page 1)
- 2. Completion of all Foundations Courses with a grade of "C" or higher
- 3. Combined GPA (all post-secondary work) of 2.5 or higher
- 4. No more than 5 non-program classes remaining
- a. Non-Program courses include general education, pre-admission, and professional education courses listed on page 1
- b. It is highly recommended to start the program with only two non-program courses remaining.
- c. Summer courses may be required if starting the program with more courses.
- 5. Completion of 42 semester hours (minimum)
- 6. A grade of "C" or higher in ALL general education courses
- 7. Be in Good Standing at SIUE

Students should submit their application online to their program of choice even if they are in the process of meeting declaration requirements or eligibility requirements. Applications will be available on our website: <a href="https://www.siue.edu/education/advising/index.shtml">https://www.siue.edu/education/advising/index.shtml</a>.

Check with your SEHHB Advisor in in January to verify your courses and grade point average that will be submitted to the admission committee. Applications are available after Labor Day through **February 1<sup>st</sup>** of each year for fall Admission. The Special Education program begins every Fall semester!

Students must complete a field placement application one semester in advance of SPE 401, 402, 418 and 499. Applications are available in SEHHBSS or at <a href="https://www.siue.edu/education/advising/index.shtml">https://www.siue.edu/education/advising/index.shtml</a>.

### **Grade requirement for Licensure:**

All professional education and content-area coursework that forms part of an application for licensure, endorsement, or approval that is received on or after February 1, 2012, must have been passed with a grade no lower than "C" or equivalent in order to be counted towards fulfillment of the applicable requirements.

#### Retention Policy:

Students must maintain at least a 3.0 GPA in professional education and special education courses to remain in the program. If the student fails to earn a C or above in education coursework or maintain the required GPA, the student will be required to reapply to the program.
