Awareness of Chagas Disease Amongst Illinois Health Professionals

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BACKGROUND

- Chagas disease is endemic to Central and South America, Trinidad, and the southern United States. (1)
- Caused by protozoan (*Trypanosoma cruzi*);
 vector is kissing bug (*Triatoma sanguisuga*)
 found here, moving north. (2)
- ~1/3 of patients with Chagas disease suffer from cardiac disorders and ~ 1/10 suffer from digestive and/or neurological disorders. (3)

FIELD/LAB METHODS

- Trapping done via Styrofoam traps lined with an LDPD5 attractant.
- Protozoan DNA extraction from bug gut.
- PCR to determine presence of pathogen.


PHONE SURVEY METHODS


- Question 1: Are you familiar with Chagas Disease/aka American Trypanosomiasis?

CONCLUSION

- ~50% of kissing bugs were positive for *T. cruzi*.
- Prevention of this disease is currently limited to general education, vector control such as bed netting, and screening of any donated blood.
- As many individuals said they were aware of Chagas disease they were unable to give further details.
- Note that at the end of each survey, all participants listened to a short educational talk to spread awareness. There is an increased need for further education as the disease continues to spread throughout the United States.
