

Kaskaskia College Associate in Arts BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Kaskaskia College fulfills SIUE's general education requirements, with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior and senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an **example** of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate's degree. Reading, writing and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying close attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

It is highly recommended that students meet with a KC advisor each semester. Please see **"Important Student Notes"** located on page of two of this transfer guide.

<sup>1</sup>MATH 166 (Analytic Geometry & Calculus I) can substitute for MATH 246. In the event that MATH 166 is taken, MATH 134 will be waived.

<sup>2</sup>MATH 136 (General Statistics) can substitute for MATH 247.

<sup>3</sup>Science courses must have one laboratory component. Physical and Life Science may be 3, 4, or 5 credit hours.

<sup>4</sup>Students must take one course from Criteria I and two courses from Criteria II, one of which is CITA 150. Minimum remaining credit hours is 4. SIUE Business Administration students choose from among the following specializations: Computer Information Systems, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business, Management, and Marketing.

## PRE-DECLARATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE - BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

- A cumulative GPA of 2.25 (on a 4.0 scale) in all college level coursework
- Completion of ENGL 101, MATH 134, and ECON 205 or ECON 206 with grades of "C" or higher

Declaration into the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration requires admission to the School of Business and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Admission to SIUE

• Completion of pre-requisite courses: ENGL 101, ENGL 102, SPCH 103, CITA 150, ECON 205, ECON 206, MATH 134, with grades of "C" or higher

- An application for the School of Business; Applications are available at http://www.siue.edu/business/.
- Above pre-requisite courses for summer admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding spring term.
- Above pre-requisite courses for fall admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding summer term.
- Above pre-requisite courses for spring admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding fall term.
- Students may not repeat MATH 166/246 or ACCT 101 more than two times

Additional required courses (although not required for admission to the School of Business) that students may not repeat more than twice are MATH 136/247 and ACCT 102; Both of these courses can possibly be completed with the associate's degree.

### SCHOOL OF BUSINESS RETENTION AND GRADUATION POLICY

- Students must maintain a 2.25 cumulative GPA
- Students who do not meet this requirement for two consecutive semesters will be removed from the program.
